KNOW YOUR FLAGS



Track days use the same flag system as you see on TV with F1 and you are expected to respect them in the same manner. Draw lines to match each track day flag to its correct meaning.



This flag means that the organiser needs to talk to you about a mechanical problem or a driving standards issue.

Shown at the end of your session, normally on the start / finish line. When you see it return to the pits.

The track is slippery. This flag usually warns of oil or water on the track.

This flag simply means danger ahead. When you see it, slow your speed down and do not overtake.

This flag means that everything is ok and you can go ahead and enjoy your lap until you're told otherwise.

You will normally see this flag when there has been an incident on the track that has a good chance of affecting other riders.

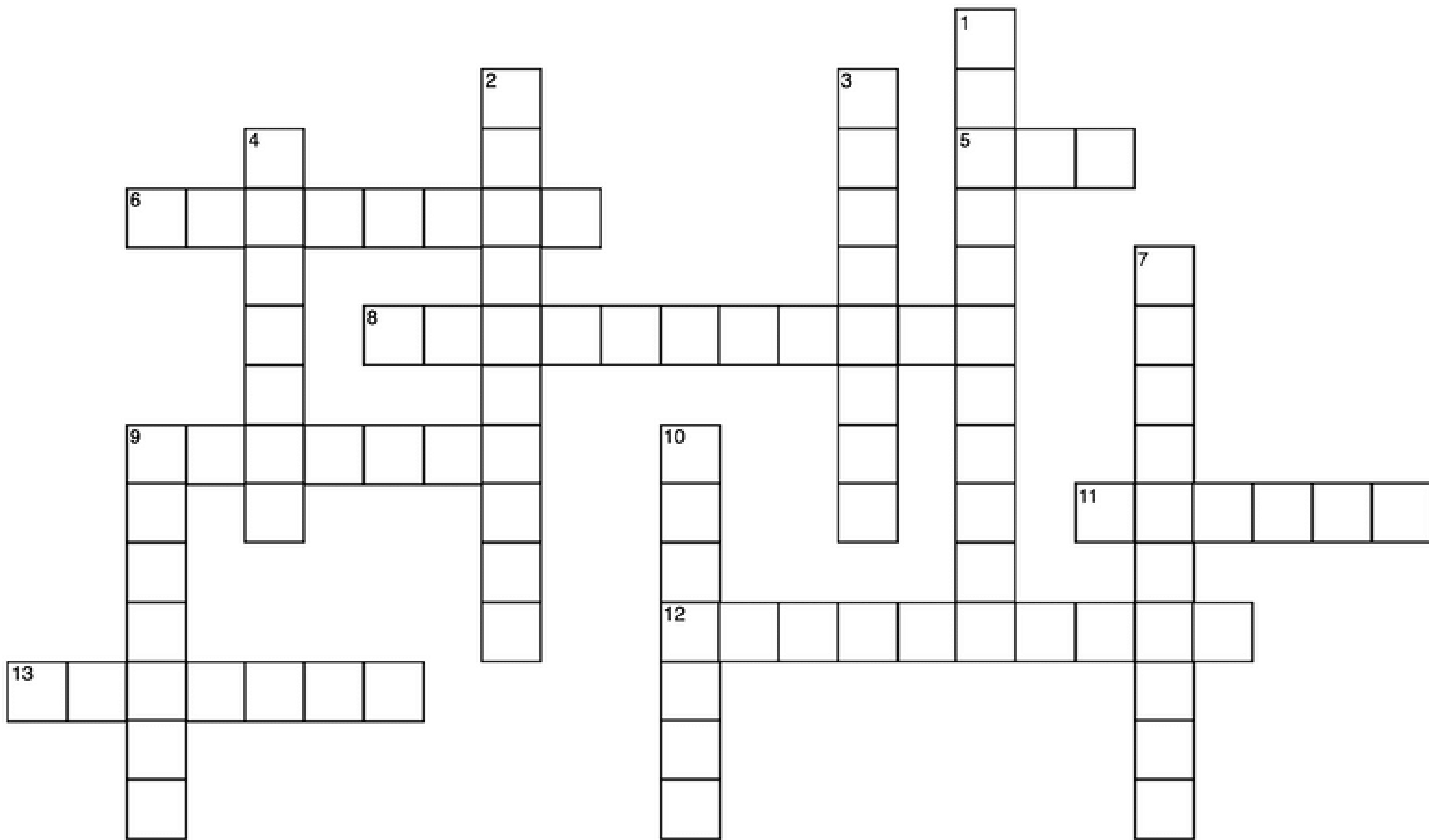
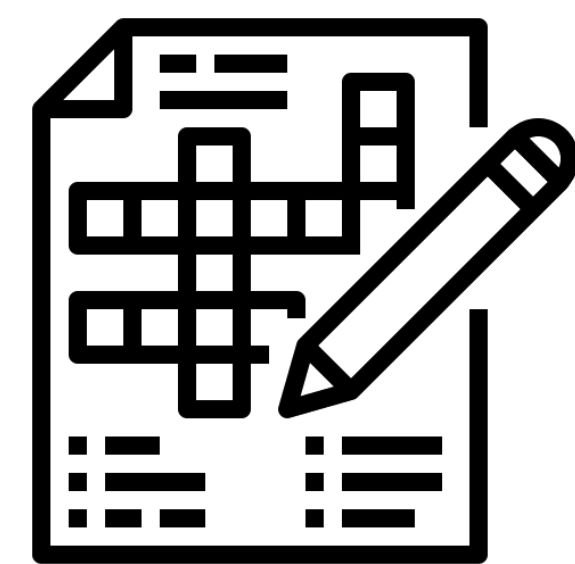

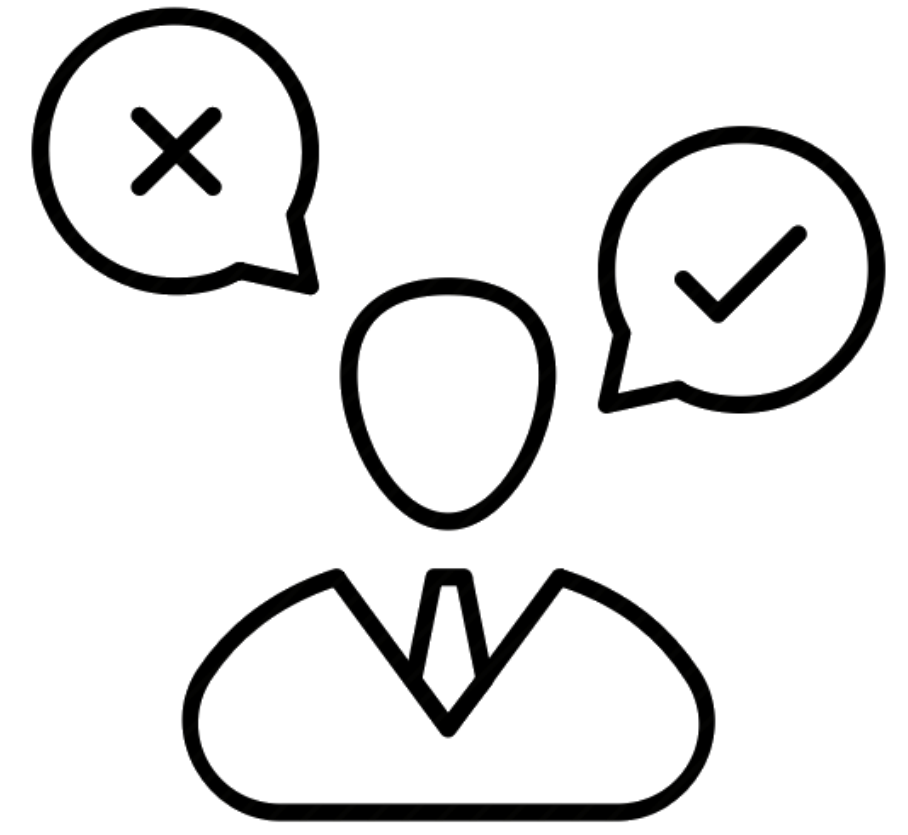

- 10. The most successful and victorious F1 team ever to exist with an astounding 238 race wins.

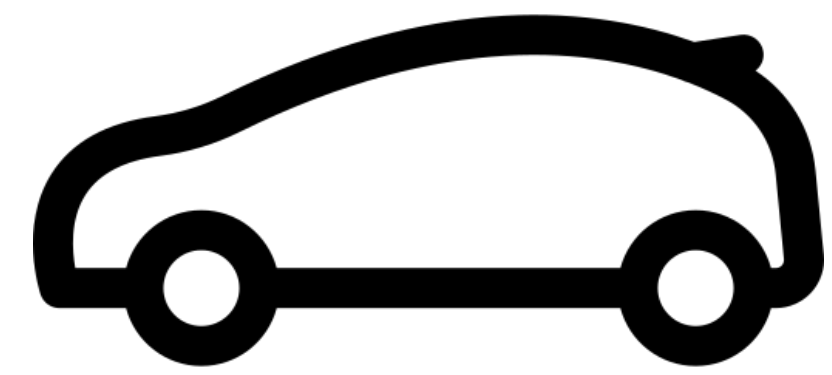
